

## Skipping School: Invisible Children

Technical Appendix: The number of children withdrawn from school to be home educated in 11 local authorities

FEBRUARY 2019

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### 1. Introduction

In October 2018 the Children's Commissioner used her legal powers under Section 2F of the Children Act 2004<sup>1</sup> to request data on the numbers of children withdrawn from school to be home educated. As a first attempt at mapping this information, the data request was sent to an initial group of 11 local authorities (LAs):

- > Birmingham
- > Bristol
- > Doncaster
- > Hackney
- > Leeds
- > Middlesbrough
- > Newham
- > North Yorkshire
- > Nottingham
- Stoke-on-Trent
- > Wakefield

Each LA was asked to return a spreadsheet providing this information for every school within the local authority. For each school, LAs were asked to report the number of pupils withdrawn to be home-educated in 2015/16, 2016/17 and 2017/18.

### 2. The sample

We received data on nearly 1,400 schools, depending on the academic year. Middlesbrough did not return data for 2015/16 and 2016/17, while North Yorkshire did not return data for 2015/16. The total number of schools in the sample was therefore 1,283 in 2015/16; 1,369 in 2016/17; and 1,385 in 2017/18.

Using the school name or identifier, we linked in publicly available data<sup>2</sup> on the characteristics of each school:

- > Phase of education (primary/secondary
- > Type of school
- > Number of pupils on the school roll

This document set out the overall levels and trajectories over time in the numbers of pupils withdrawn into elective home education (EHE) per year. To take into account changes in the school population, or differences in school size between different types of school, the analysis also shows EHE referral rates per 1,000 pupils. Additional results by each local authority are presented in the Annexes.

### 3. The number of and trend in EHE referrals

#### 3.1 The overall number and rate of EHE referrals

Our dataset shows the following numbers of EHE referrals:

The first row of Table 1 suggests that there has been very strong growth in the number of EHE referrals, but this is confounded by the fact that the dataset contains more schools in 2016/17 and even more schools in 2017/18, due to the reporting issue set out of above. Analysis of changes over time in the total number of EHE referrals therefore restricts the sample to the 9 LAs, in order to provide consistency. Changes over time in the average per school and the rate per 1,000 pupils are calculated across all 11 LAs, as these measures are not artificially inflated by including more schools.




Figure 1: Trend over time in EHE referrals

Table 2 shows the trend over time and makes clear that the growth in EHE referrals across the areas in this sample has accelerated considerably after 2016/17. Figure 1, below, shows the trend over time visually.

Note: Total number is based only on the nine areas which provided data for all three years, so it excludes Middlesbrough and North Yorkshire. The rate per 1,000 pupils is based on all 11 areas.

Annex 1 presents the overall EHE referral figures and rates per 1,000 pupils by local authority.

### 3.2 The distribution of EHE referrals

Looking at the total or the average does not convey how much variation there is in the numbers of referrals, or how concentrated these referrals are among a small number of schools. To illustrate this, Table 3 shows what proportion of EHE referrals is accounted for by the 1%, 5%, 10%, 20% and 25% of schools with the highest EHE referral numbers.




Figure 2: Trend over time in distribution of EHE referrals

Table 3 indicates that the distribution has become slightly less unequal over time (although this could be influenced by the changing sample of schools as well). However, the distribution is also moving to the right: over this period it has become less likely for the schools in this sample to have 0 EHE referrals, and slightly more likely for them to have a high number of EHE referrals. This is shown in Figure 2 below. Between 2015-16

and 2017-18, the proportion of schools making no referrals at all to home education fell from 59% to 49%, while the proportion of schools making more than five referrals rose from 1.9% to 4.3%.

# 4. Differences in EHE referral rates between different types of school

This section compares levels of and trends in EHE referrals between different parts of the school system to examine whether there are any differences. Given that different types of school may differ in size, the analysis here focuses on EHE referral rates per 1,000 pupils.

### 4.1 Differences by phase of school




Figure 3: Trend over time in EHE referral rate, by phase of school

Figure 3 shows that the EHE referral rate is higher among secondary schools than among primary schools across our sample of 11 LAs. However, rates have been increasing for both – and between 2016/17 and 2017/18, the rate increased faster among primary schools than among secondary schools.

Annex 3 contains additional results, breaking down these by local authority as well.

### 4.2 Differences by type of school




Figure 4. Trend over time in EHE referral rate, by type of school

Figure 4 shows that the EHE referral rate is higher among academies than among LA-maintained schools, however rates have increased for both types of school. Most recently, between 2016/17 and 2017/18, the EHE referral rate increased more quickly in LA-maintained schools (by 49%) than in academies (by 25%).

The chart also shows that EHE referral rates per 1,000 pupils are much higher in pupil referral units (PRUs) across the 11 LAs in this dataset. The rate has also increased very sharply since 2015/16. However, these figures are based on a small number of referrals across a very small cohort of pupils in the 11 LAs: 17 referrals among 471 pupils in 2017/18. By comparison, across the same LAs there were 303,000 pupils in LAmaintained schools and 322,000 in academies in 2017/18. The PRU figures may be volatile and difficult to generalise from, in the absence of data from more LAs across more years.


